

During the month of May the Maysville-Mason County Landfill received a total of 7067.11 tons of waste valued at \$147,161.40 (not including DP&L operational costs). Kentucky Environmental Remediation Fees were \$9525.52. The FGD fill received a total of 25,795.33 tons valued at \$77,098.74. Roll-off business had a total of \$31,627.10 in billable accounts. 596,700 gallons of leachate were hauled from the Maysville-Mason County Landfill to the city pump station.

Contained Landfill

Normal landfilling activities are on going. Net DMR was submitted for the month. Quarterly Inspection performed by the Division of Waste, no violations observed. The KPDES Permit was finally renewed and the changes are attached to this reports. Two sample locations were removed, along with several parameters from the reporting Outfalls. This should reduce the cost of our monthly and quarterly sampling.

Residual Landfill

Normal maintenance is ongoing since no material is being disposed. Began process of increasing cover dirt and over newly filled areas and filling in areas lacking sufficient cover. Cleaned FGD Phase 2 line.

COUNTY OF Mason
RESOLUTION #16-04

The purpose of this Resolution is to outline the responsibilities of the Mason County Fiscal Court, Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue, and Mason County Emergency Management.

Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue is the only officially recognized land based rescue squad and water rescue from a boat in Mason County.

The Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue shall serve the citizens of Mason County by providing fully trained and equipped personnel who will take the lead role in the following types of missions:

- (1) Searches for missing persons and,
- (2) Low angle rescue.
- (3) Water rescue and recovery without divers

The Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue will respond and assist, but not take the lead role in the following types of missions:

- (1) Incident management assistance at scenes.
- (2) Swift Water Rescue and High Angle Rescue
- (3) Water Rescue or recovery requiring divers

The Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue may be called to respond by any of the following services or agencies and will respond per availability of resources and personnel:

- (1) Joseph Pfeffer, County Judge/Executive
- (2) Tim Nolder, EM Director
- (3) KyEM Area Manager
- (4) State SAR Coordinator
- (5) Division of Emergency Management

The Mason County Dispatch will contact the Chief or Assistant Chief of Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue, providing an address and nearest cross street/road on any incident in Mason County when any rescue squad assistance is needed.

In all Mason County declared states of emergencies, the Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue will fall under the direction and control of the Mason County Emergency Management and/or the Mason County Judge/Executive. The rescue squad shall operate under its own chain of command during the state of emergency.

If emergencies occur in Bracken, Fleming, Robertson, and Mason Counties simultaneously, priority will be given to Mason County. Personnel will be assigned by the chief officers as personnel are available. This Resolution does not influence the organizational by-laws, standard operating procedures, or other powers of the Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue Incident Command System except during a declared emergency.

The Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue shall maintain its equipment and property and shall be accountable for all equipment through an annual inventory which will be submitted to the Director of the Mason County Emergency Management.

The Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue shall be responsible for all funds donated to the squad by outside resources. The treasurer of the Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue shall assure all payments of outstanding debts in a timely manner. The Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue shall not charge for any of its services except as allowed through mutual aid at the request of KyEM or the FEMA EMAC system.

The Mason County Fiscal Court may provide "Official" license plates and insurance for newly acquired rescue vehicles upon written request and approval of the Mason County Fiscal Court

The responsibilities of all parties to this Resolution shall conform to those responsibilities as provided in KRS Chapter 39F.

This Resolution can be updated, modified, amended, or cancelled upon written request of any one of the parties. If a vacancy should occur in any of the positions on this Resolution, the Resolution will remain in effect for thirty days while the Resolution is renegotiated.

This Resolution shall be in effect for the period beginning July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017. The Mason County Fiscal Court agrees to pay Buffalo Trace Search and Rescue \$2,031 (25 cents *per capita* (8,124) per 2010 Census) for those living outside the city limits to help with operational needs of the SAR Team.
