<u>US Bike Route 21 – Encroachment Permit</u>

The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet will fabricate and install the signs and the county will be responsible to replace any signs that are damaged or destroyed. The National Bicycle Route 21 will connect Atlanta, Georgia, to Cleveland, Ohio.
